TARIFF - VARIOUS: BACKGROUND MUSIC – HOTELS & CASINOS

Tariff for the communicating to the public of sound recordings including public performance.

Effective from: 01 January 2023

The communicating of sound recordings to the public is a restricted act in terms of the NAMIBIAN Copyright Act (Act 6 of 1994, as amended) and copy right and related rights Act (8 of 2016, section 10 as amended) and requires a licence from NASCAM for the use of sound recordings and performing rights. This document sets out

This document sets out how the tariffs applicable to **HOTELS & CASINOS** are determined as they do not fall under one specific tariff but various tariffs based on audible area and music usage thereof when **background music** is used.

Below are some examples of possible applicable tariffs, but not limited to, based on type of business and usage thereof:

Where sound recordings are played as featured music rather than for background music, the following additional tariffs will apply:

Tariff 03: Specially Featured Entertainment (Discos, Nightclubs, etc.)

Tariff 37: Featured Entertainment

The various tariffs are subject to NASCAM's "General Terms and Conditions for Communicating Sound Recordings to the Public Licences", a copy of which can be accessed on NASCAM's website

or obtained by contacting NASCAM (see contact details here above).

Penalty Clause – A NASCAM licence should be obtained before sound recordings are publicly communicated. Should sound recordings be communicated to the public without first obtaining or renewing

a licence, a surcharge can be added to this tariff. This is designed to act as a deterrent to unlicensed communications to the public of sound recordings.

The licence fee payable is based on the applicable tariff(s) and criteria for each specific tariff.

Definitions:

"Audible Area" means the total area, measured in square metres, in which the publicly performed sound recordings can be heard on the premises (whether indoors or outdoors). If there are a number of storeys, floors or levels within the premises (including mezzanine floors or balcony areas), the audible area of each storey, floor or level should be included for the purposes of measuring the total audible area of the premises.

"Background Music" means the playing of recorded music to create an atmosphere or ambience that is not a special feature of, or essential to, the main event or is not essential to the operation of the premises.

"Featured Music" means the playing of sound recordings as a main or special attraction that is essential to the operation of the premises and/or the main event.

"Repertoire" means the collection of copyright sound recordings owned or controlled by members of NASCAM from time to time.
