TARIFF 05: BACKGROUND MUSIC – AIRCRAFT

Tariff for the communicating to the public of sound recordings including public performance.

Effective from: 01January 2023

1. The communicating of sound recordings to the public is a restricted act in terms of the NAMIBIAN Copyright Act (Act 6 of 1994, as amended) and copy right and related rights Act (8 of 2016, section 10 as amended) and requires a licence from NASCAM for the use of sound recordings and performing rights. This document sets out

NASCAM's tariff for the communicating to the public of sound recordings in AIRCRAFT.

- 2. This tariff is subject to NASCAM's "General Terms and Conditions for Communicating Sound Recordings to the Public Licences", a copy of which can be accessed on NASCAM's website (http://www.nascam.org.na) or obtained by contacting NASCAM at No.5 Johnson Street, Eros.
- 3. This tariff applies to the communicating to the public of sound recordings in aircraft as **background music**. There are specific types of communicating sound recordings to the public that NASCAM does not classify as **background music**, and which are licensed under separate tariffs. Apart from these exceptions, all other types of public performance are classified as **background music**.
- 4. Penalty Clause A NASCAM licence should be obtained before sound recordings are publicly communicated. Should sound recordings be communicated to the public without first obtaining or renewing a licence, a penalty can be added to this tariff. This is designed to act as a deterrent to unlicensed communications to the public of sound recordings.
- 5. Fees:

N\$56.63 each seat per annum.

Subject to a minimum fee of N\$505.51 each aircraft per

annum.

6. Explanatory Notes:

To issue an accurate licence, the number of aircrafts in the fleet, as well as the seating capacity of each aircraft must be specified.

7. Definitions:

"Background Music" means the playing of recorded music to create an atmosphere or ambience that is not a special feature of, or essential to, the main event or is not essential to the operation of the premises.

"**Repertoire**" means the collection of copyright sound recordings owned or controlled by members of NASCAM from time to time.
